HOW TO REACH ROME

By Air - The main airport of Rome is Leonardo da Vinci in Fiumicino, about 30 kilometers southwest of the city. The other airport is Ciampino, where most domestic, and some international flights arrive, about 15 kilometers southeast of the city.

You can easily get a bus from the airport that would drop you to a stop close to your hotel or the central station in less than an hour. The buses are comfortable and way cheaper than taxis. There's also the Leonardo Express train that will take you from the airport into the main city. Stop by at the Information Centre and ask the stop closest to your destination.

By Train - Rome is well served by rail connections to all the major cities in Italy and Europe. The main railway station here is Roma Termini.

By Car - The main road connecting Rome to the north and south of Italy is the Autostrada del Sole, which connects with the ring road circling the city. If you plan to drive anywhere in Italy you would require an international driving licence.
